

Fire Company Support at Technical Rescue Incidents

Approaching the Scene

- Compile facts and factors about the call.
- Gain size-up information.
- Information is important to overall success of the rescue operation.
- Information received in an emergency call should include:
 - Location of incident
 - Nature of incident (kinds and number of vehicles)
 - Condition and position of victims
 - Number of people trapped or injured, and types of injuries
 - Any specific or special hazard information
 - Name of person calling and number where he or she can be reached
- Identify and correct life-threatening hazards.
- **A size-up should include:**
 - **Scope and magnitude of the incident**
 - **Risk and benefit analysis**
 - **Number of known and potential victims**
 - **Hazards**
 - **Access to the scene**
 - **Environmental factors**
 - **Available and necessary resources**
 - **Establishment of control perimeter**
